ig Sky Country in Southwest Montana has lots to offer Fido and his family with its vast horizons and abundant landscape. The outdoor enthusiast will feel right at home as many properties can facilitate a fishing or whitewater trip, or ar-

range for horseback riding for you and your family.

A recent trip with our two tail-wagging "Directors of Barketing"—Zoey and Mattie—included tours of three Fido-friendly properties. All of them offered beautiful Montana sunsets and welcoming breezes.

The Bar N Ranch

The Bar N Ranch is located roughly six miles west of West Yellowstone, Montana, only 10 minutes from the west entrance of Yellowstone National Park.

Resident wildlife and breathtaking views compliment the rustic, yet elegant surroundings. Jetted spa tubs, wood-burning fireplaces, private outdoor hot tubs and wireless internet are only a few of the added distinctions that highlight your stay. The South Fork of the famed Madison River meanders through the 200-acre ranch, offering private access to guests of the ranch. Zoey and Mattie enjoyed frolicking off-leash with resident dog, Ranger.

If you ask the locals, they will probably tell you that fall is their favorite time of year to visit southwest Montana. The weather's great, the aspens are turning yellow, there's fabulous hiking and excellent fishing (some say the best of the year), and you'll feel like you have the entire state to yourself.

> Breakfast is included and served in the lodge. Choices include hearty French toast and simpler fare. We were lucky to have dinner reservations as it turned out that the lodge was booked for the entire weekend. Travelers and guests look forward to the cuisine that is served in the rustic lodge dining room. Try the prawn and pear

salad for starters and make the difficult choice for entrée. Your well-behaved dog is allowed to stay alone in the cabin, so no need to rush your dining experience.

Spend the day in Yellowstone where your dog is allowed within 100 feet from the paved roads. While in town, search out the Nordic trail where you and your dog can hike in all seasons but winter. (www.rendezvousskitrails.com)

Next stop, the Rainbow Ranch

Located in the heart of Big Sky country and on the banks of the Gallatin River, the Rainbow Ranch Lodge is an intimate Montana guest ranch offering world-class luxury with relaxed elegance, personalized guest service and unrivaled ambiance.

The Fido-friendly Riverside Log Cabins overlooking the Gallatin River are a fisherman's paradise. Ideal for a romantic getaway for two or a fly fishing retreat for 10, the cabins range from two to five bedrooms and are all just a stone's throw from the Gallatin River.

We were ensconced in the Cougar, one of




the cabins on the river. We relaxed on our private porch in two Adirondack chairs while Zoey and Mattie rested beside us. There were horses on property and 'the girls' kept their eyes peeled for any excitement, but other than that, they were both content to rest by the river and listen to the quiet while we took in the beauty of the Gallatin National Forest across the river.

All riverside luxury rooms offer comfort and amenities with 1,000-thread count, Egyptian cotton sheets and down comforters on handcrafted lodge pole beds with whirlpool baths and rosemary-lavender bath salts, satellite television, wood burning river rock fireplaces and individual decks overlooking the Gallatin River.

Owner Patrick Hurd converted this former fishing camp into a fantastic retreat that features one of the best restaurants in the area. We enjoyed a fancy feast of pan-seared breast of duck and cast iron-charred Ahi tuna along with a bottle of local wine from the well-stocked wine cellar. During dinner, we also enjoyed listening to the fisherman at the nearby table talk about 'the one that got away.'

Last stop, Brackett Creek cabin, Bozeman, Montana

Before we left home for our trip to Montana, we received by mail a wonderful packet of information from the folks at Mountain Home, Montana Vacation Rentals. The Brackett Creek two-bedroom cabin is located at the edge of the Gallatin National Forest and sits on 118 acres in a secluded location between Bozeman and Livingston. There is a lawn area leading down to Brackett Creek and a small stream meanders through the front yard.

The home has a large deck and was a perfect spot for all of us to watch for wildlife and birds. We did see wild turkeys strutting up the driveway one morning. Thankfully, Zoey and Mattie were still sleeping at the time.

We walked up the hill behind the cabin and greeted grazing horses each morning. The horses soon became accustomed to seeing us and would walk towards us as if to greet us themselves.

With access to miles of hiking/biking/horseback-riding trails and fishing on Brackett Creek, the only trouble you may find is in not having enough time to enjoy it all.
